GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Activities: Actions taken or work performed, through which inputs are mobilized to produce outputs.

Baseline Year: Reference year when the baseline value was captured.

Baseline: A standard against which performance, achievements or an intervention can be assessed or comparisons made.

Goal: A broad statement generally describing a desired outcome for a project. It is the broader regional, sectoral or national objective that a project and/or activity is expected to contribute towards.

Indicators: Specific quantified measurements related to the extent a project/programme or organization is reaching objectives or targets.

Inputs: The financial, human, material and information resources used to produce outputs through activities and to accomplish outcomes.

Objective: A measurable statement about the end result that a project/programme is expected to accomplish in a given period of time.

Outcomes: Measures the intermediate results/describe the action change in conditions/ changed practices as a result of a programme or project activity/output.

Outputs: Measurement of goods and services produced.

Plan: an outline of programmes and activities designed on the basis of past learning as well as current needs and sustainability prospects, so as to bring about qualitative changes in the lives of people by means of socio-economic development.

Programme: A series of interrelated projects with a common overall objective.

Project: a collection of interdependent and coordinated activities geared towards achieving the particular objective of a plan or policy within a predetermined budget and time schedule.

Result: A describable or measurable change in state that is derived from a cause-and-effect relationship.

Stakeholder(s): Specific people or groups who have a stake in the implementation of the Policy. Normally, stakeholders could include state and non-state actors and the Kenyan citizens.

FOREWORD

he National Treasury and Economic Planning, through the State Department for Economic Planning, has compiled the Fourth National Reporting Indicator Handbook. This collaborative effort involved engagement with stakeholders from various Government Ministries, Departments, and Agencies (MDAs). The primary objective of this Handbook is to monitor the execution of the Fourth Medium Term Plan (MTP IV) for the period 2023-2027 within the framework of Kenya Vision 2030. This initiative aligns with the constitutional principles of Kenya and is dedicated to realizing the priorities outlined in the Bottom-Up Economic Transformation Agenda (BETA).

The Handbook serves as a tool to enhance transparency and accountability by presenting a clear set of performance indicators and targets for the MTP IV. Its development was guided by the sectors outlined in MTP IV, namely Finance and Production, Infrastructure, Social, Environment and Natural Resources, and Governance and Public Administration.

Within the Handbook, each sector has both outcome and key output indicators, with annual targets. These indicators play a crucial role in allowing citizens to examine the level of implementation of policies, programs, and projects. Furthermore, to streamline the reporting process, each MDA is required to upload the relevant indicators into the Electronic National Integrated Monitoring and Evaluation System (e-NIMES) platform and regularly update on achievements for maintaining transparency and accountability.

In adherence to a robust monitoring and evaluation framework, within the structured e-NIMES platform, MDAs are obligated to provide quarterly and annual reports on the progress of their respective programs and projects. This data will contribute to the generation of real-time information and high-quality Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) reports.



Lastly, appreciation is extended to Mr. James Muhati, CBS, the Principal Secretary of the State Department for Economic Planning, for providing leadership in the preparation of this Handbook. It is anticipated that this Handbook will play a pivotal role in establishing a well-coordinated and efficient reporting mechanism for the implementation of the MTP IV.

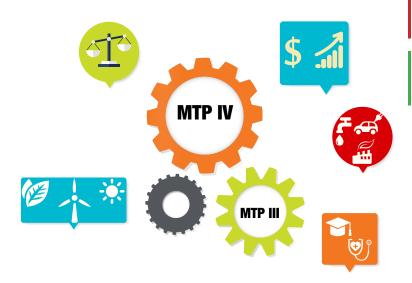
INTRODUCTION

ndicators are factors or variables that provide a simple and reliable means to measure achievement, reflect the changes connected to an intervention, or help assess the performance of a development actor. Indicators therefore define a measure of change for the objective statements at all levels of the results framework — strategic objective and intermediate results as well as outputs. Indicators ensure evidence-based decision making, support a project adaptive capacity and advance learning. For systematic monitoring of plans, policies, programmes, and projects, it is necessary to develop and use performance indicators that are impartial, independent, simple/ unambiguous, measurable, achievable, reliable, comparable, practical, representative, time-bound and firmly aligned with intended objectives.

The National Treasury through the State Department for Economic Planning has prepared the Fourth National Reporting Indicator Handbook to track the implementation of the Fourth Medium Term Plan (MTP IV) 2023-2027 of Kenya Vision 2030. The MTP IV National Reporting Indicators satisfy the indicator development criteria of being Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Relevant and Time bound to ensure gathering of reliable evidence about how much or how well objectives are being or have been achieved.

The Handbook is a successor to the Third National Reporting Indicator Handbook for the Third MTP. The Handbook contains more comprehensive targets covering the five MTP IV sectors namely: Finance and Production; Infrastructure; Social; Environment and Natural Resources; and Governance and Public Administration. It also includes indicators underpinning macroeconomic framework.

This Handbook will be a key pillar in the performance monitoring framework for the realization of the BETA objectives and other



Government priorities. The Handbook establishes agreed parameters for ministerial priorities in the national development Plan and offers to have their performances at these levels tracked for effective delivery. The indicators have been aligned to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and other international obligations.

The Handbook will be a guide in preparation of the Annual and Quarterly progress reports for the Fourth MTP of the Kenya Vision 2030. These reports are part of the reporting obligations by public institutions and Non-Governmental Organizations within the national monitoring framework. The Handbook will therefore play a major role in understanding the degree of effectiveness of the development policies of the Government and performance of those responsible for delivering the priorities of the Government.

The Handbook is organized into two parts. The first part captures the outcome indicators while the second part captures output indicators of key Government interventions under each of the five sectors.
